QUALIFICATION DESCRIPTION:

This qualification provides a pathway to the primary trades in the construction industry with the exception of plumbing. It provides trade outcomes that are typically achieved through an apprenticeship and allows for inclusion of skills suited for entry to off-site occupations, such as joinery as well as carpentry, bricklaying and other occupations in general construction.

This qualification is designed to introduce learners to the recognised trade callings in the construction industry and provide meaningful credit in a construction industry apprenticeship.

QUALIFICATION PACKAGING RULES:

For the award of the CPC20220 Certificate II in Construction Pathways, the candidate must demonstrate competency in 10 units of competency: 5 core units and 5 elective units.

ASSESSMENT:

Assessment is competency based and therefore no levels of achievement are awarded. Assessment for this qualification is continuous and units of competency have been clustered into groups and are assessed in 3 Projects, culminating in a Folio of Work. Observations also form part of the Folio and must be demonstrated in-class.

CAREERS:

The first project of this course is White Card (or general construction induction card). When student have completed their White Card, they will be able to start work on a construction site. Careers may also include traineeships, apprenticeships or further study at TAFE.
