- spiralling curriculum: ensuring literacies are developed from year 7: apprenticeship of students into ways of acting, thinking, responding & creating
- Appropriate professional development
  - 1. whole school—in key priority areas of Comprehension, writing, spelling, literacy training and subject literacies
  - 2. faculty/individuals—staff as experts in subject literacies
- Assessment to reflect key literacies of subject areas
  - review of assessment
  - appropriate professional development to ensure subject currency
- Acknowledgement of value of all subject literacies & all subjects
  - not only an emphasis on traditional literacies of readina & writina
  - also acknowledgement of more practical literacies
