To achieve this successfully, the focus for these sessions will be, under supervision, to develop basic skills and knowledge for working in a broad range of settings with a range of clients, to identify personal learning goals and needs, to develop an individual learning plan and seek feedback for performance improvement. Students will focus on addressing the needs and expectations of clients and colleagues (other students), promote programs, services and facilities and respond to conflict and client complaints. Students will also complete an equipment maintenance report and conduct repairs where needed.
