

FORMAL UNIFORM

BOYS

- Shirt – Years 7-9 only – chambray shirt, pale green, embroidered school emblem on pocket. To be worn outside long green trousers with a black belt.
Years 10-12 only – White dress shirt (short or long sleeved and to be worn tucked in, and only to be worn with the bottle green trousers with a black belt
- Bottle green long trousers (belted style, no cargo style pockets) are to be worn with a black belt
- Tie – Years 10-12 – required to be worn as part of the formal uniform
- Socks - CHSHS school striped socks or all white socks (no branding), mid-calf (crew) length only.
- Totally black lace-up shoes with impervious uppers are required for formal uniform. No canvas shoes or sports shoes are permitted. The Australian Podiatry Council advises footwear, especially for the amount of hours in a school day, should provide cushioning and support

GIRLS

- Blouse – Years 7-9 – bottle green and white check, short or long sleeved, flat collar on V neck, action back, worn outside the skirt/slacks.
Years 10-12 – white, short or long sleeved, flat collar on V neck, buttons down front, actions back, worn outside the skirt/slacks
- Skirt/Slacks - bottle green, six gore with two inverted pleats back and front, on or below knee length
- Tailored dress slacks
- Tie – Years 10-12 required to be worn as part of the formal uniform
- All-white knee-high socks or black stockings (ankle socks and mid-calf socks are not permitted)
- Totally black lace-up shoes with impervious uppers. (No canvas shoes or sports shoes are permitted). The Australian Podiatry Council advises footwear, especially for the amount of hours in a school day, should provide cushioning and support

SPORT UNIFORM Unisex

- Polo Shirt - green/yellow with white piping and CHSHS logo embroidered on left side, short or long sleeved.
- Shorts – bottle green microfiber shorts with logo embroidered on bottom left-hand
- Socks – CHSHS school stripe socks only, ankle or crew
- School hat (available from CHSHS Uniform shop) – mandatory for Years 7 and 8, and encouraged for Years 9 to 12 in 2022
- Sports shoes – no sandals, skate shoes, hi-tops or canvas shoes permitted – see shoe diagram. Shoes worn by our students are to provide cushioning and support
- Microfibre tracksuit jacket and pants - to be school tracksuit only. Softshell jacket may also be worn.
- Swimming – togs, preferably in school colours, should be worn at representative level; modest bonafide togs which are acceptable to supervisors to be worn at other times

NOTE: All uniforms are only available from the school Uniform Shop

P&C UNIFORM SHOP HOURS:

- Mon, Tue, Wed 8.00am – 12.00pm
- Thurs 1.00pm - 4.30pm

Closed on Fridays, pupil-free days and the last Thursday of each term.

OTHER OPTIONS

These may be worn with formal or sports uniforms.

Woolen Knit Jumper	Plain bottle green with school logo
or Cotton Acrylic Jumper	
Soft-shell Jacket	Plain bottle green with school logo
Year 12 Jersey	Design selected by students.
School Hat	Reversible green and purple with school logo, resizeable toggle

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OUR DRESS CODE

Aims to:-

- allow students to be immediately identifiable as a Centenary Heights student
- be comfortable and sunsafe
- look neat and tidy
- be appropriate for school activities
- be appealing so students want to wear it (students are represented on the Uniform Working Party when it meets)
- be affordable
- give students some choice within the elements

Students are required to have as their basic uniform one full formal uniform and one full sport uniform.

GENERAL DRESS CODE EXPECTATIONS

Personal appearance

1. Personal cleanliness is essential.
2. Hair colouring is to be kept within the natural hair colour range and styles are to be conservative and neat.
3. Make-up should have a natural/neutral look and be generally undetectable. This will include light foundation or tinted moisturiser only and should not be detectable as it will blend with your natural skin colour. A neutral coloured or clear lip balm may be applied; however, this too will blend with your natural lip colour. Eye make-up is not permitted and this includes false eyelashes, eyelash extensions and eyelash tints. Contouring products are not permitted. A clear nail polish may be worn over your natural nails, but coloured polish, gel/acrylic/prescription nail overlays are not permitted.
4. In workshops and laboratories hair is to be restrained. Hair ribbons and other hair accessories are to be in the school colours (green, gold or purple).
5. Students are to be clean shaven or have neatly trimmed facial hair.
6. Clothes are to be clean and worn neatly at all times.
7. For boys, a plain black belt is to be worn with long trousers.
8. Socks are to be worn under, not over pants. Track suit pants are not to be rolled up or drawn in with elastic or cord etc.
9. Scarves/beanies may be worn in winter with both formal and sports uniforms, in the following colours: bottle green or purple. No other colours or stripes are part of the uniform. Polar fleece green scarf and/or purple beanie with embroidered school logo is available from the Uniform Shop and can be worn separately or as a set.
10. Hijab colours are to be bottle green or black.
11. Undershirts are not permitted to be worn.
12. Year 10, 11 and 12 students are required to wear the school tie when wearing formal uniform at all times.
13. The wearing of hats or caps is highly recommended when outdoors to protect against the sun. During regulated sport and physical education classes it is mandatory. The CHSHS sports hat is compulsory for Years 7-8 and

encouraged for Years 9-12. Hats are not permitted to be worn inside buildings.

14. Tattoos are not permitted, including henna.
15. The school uniform is not to be modified.

Please note:

- Any student wearing clothing which is not school uniform, on a given day, is requested to exchange the item at the Textbook Office for a school uniform piece and return that uniform item laundered within 48 hours
- Darling Downs or other representative clothing is not permitted to be worn at school
- The full formal uniform is required to be worn by students when representing the school, on formal occasions, for school photos, and when stipulated by the Principal
- The full sports uniform is required to be worn for sport, physical education classes and may be worn by choice at any other time

Jewellery

- Students are permitted to wear two plain sleepers and ear studs which may include a small white/plain stone, a watch, a plain ring, one discreet chain of religious significance (on a long chain to be worn inside the shirt so it is not visible) and school badges. Studs should be the size of the original piercing. Sleepers should be no larger than 12mm in diameter

- Visible body piercings to the tongue, lip, jaw, brow, cheek are not permitted. No visible studs, rings or bars are to be worn. Any existing nose piercings must be removed or accommodate a small clear stud
- Ear lobes with wide holes are not acceptable. Should a student, on enrolment, have these as pre-existing the requirement is that the earrings will be flat on both sides of the earlobe; 6mm or 8mm and flesh/clear coloured

Shoes

Appropriate footwear with impervious uppers is required to be worn in work rooms/ practical areas, e.g. Industrial Skills, Science, Hospitality and Art.

For daily wear students may wear either:

- ◆ sports shoes – conservative colours preferred (but not canvas, hi-tops or skate shoes), and are to provide appropriate cushioning and support or
- ◆ black formal shoes – lace-up only and impervious uppers. See below for visual detail on what shoes are acceptable for daily wear and which ones are not.

CHSHS Formal Uniform – What works?

- YES:** Black leather lace-up

- NO:** Insufficient foot coverage and foot support or non-impervious uppers



CHSHS Sports Uniform – What works?

- YES:** Fully enclosed runners
Safe, full-foot protection and support



- NO:** Insufficient foot coverage and foot support or non-protective uppers
